Wednesday next, 14th February, is Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent.

Mass in Quin at **9.15am** and **7.00pm**. Holy ashes will be distributed at each Mass.

The season of Lent is a period of preparation for Easter, the great feast of the Christian calendar. The Gospel tells us how to approach the renewal of our lives during Lent. It puts before us the remedy of prayer, fasting and alms-giving. These three strands of Lenten observance are as ancient as Christianity itself.

Ash Wednesday is a day of Fast and Abstinence. (Along with Good Friday, it is the only other day of the year when such rules apply). By fasting, one restricts the amount of food consumed during the one-day period, and by abstaining one refrains from eating meat.
