#### **Mammoth Challenge & Brilliant Achievement**

On Sunday, 31st July, a very large number of the members of Clooney/Quin GAA Club took part in one of the most challenging activities imaginable, all with the noble aim of raising awareness of the plight of the less fortunate in our society. They joined up with colleagues from the Kilburn Gaels Club (London) and Gort GAA, to cycle together in groups on separate journeys, as follows: (a) Dublin to Gort, 192 Kms. (b) Athlone to Gort, 80 Kms, and (c) Clooney to Gort, 30 Kms. The three groups came together that evening on the streets of Gort, where they were greeted by a huge throng which showered them with congratulations. All the participants were supported by family & friends with generous sponsorship and a total of £30,000 (pounds sterling) was gathered for the twin causes – MSI (*Multiple Sclerosis Ireland*), and the *Cormac Foundation* (in memory of Cormac McAllen) which carries out research into SADS (*Sudden Adult Death Syndrome*.).
