## Corpus Christi

We celebrate today The Feast of Corpus Christi. The Eucharist is the source and centre of our Roman Catholic Faith through the ages and at present. Jesus gave us the Mass as a memorial of Him. At the Last Supper, the night before He died, Jesus gave His Body and Blood to His Disciples and to us saying "take this and eat it, this is my body, take and drink, this is my blood. This was the First Mass. Since then it is our privilege to attend Mass and receive Holy Communion. The people of Ireland always had a great reverence for the Mass. During the Penal Laws (16-95-1746) attendance at Holy Mass was prohibited so the Eucharist was celebrated in isolated places using a boulder as the altar. These boulders are now known as Mass Rocks. Our ancestors risked their lives by attending Mass but did so out of their love for the Eucharist.
