In addition, one must be willing to follow Christ and not have any excuses for delaying this decision.

How free are you to follow Christ? Are you willing to put Christ first and not be concerned about food, shelter, etc.? As you live each day, do you find excuses for not living as a Christian? Take time to find a way to follow Christ. Ask for the grace of freedom in doing so.
