Changes in the Parish

From this weekend, 26/27th August, 2017, the parish of Quin-Clooney-Maghera is entering an era of change and uncertainty. To begin with, this is the last weekend in the ministry in our parish of Fr. Ignatius McCormack as he leaves to take up the post of full-time Principal of St. Flannan's College, Ennis, the Diocesan Secondary School (with 1,200 students and 100 staff). In consequence, and for the first time in living memory, this parish will not have a resident Catholic priest. On July 7, 2017, Bishop Monahan issued a statement to all parishioners (published in this Newsletter) in which he explained the difficulties caused by shortage of priests in the diocese, and outlined the contingency measures being put in place locally as a result. In his *Pastoral Letter*, published at Easter, the Bishop had addressed the issue of similar changes occurring widely across the Diocese in coming years.

We welcome **Fr. Tom O'Gorman**, parish priest of Cloughleigh, Ennis, who, at the request of the Bishop, will take on the additional responsibility of *Parish Administrator* for Quin-Clooney-Maghera, while continuing to reside at the Presbytery, Cloughleigh. The priests of the other three parishes in the partnership of the *Abbey Cluster* (Ennis, Doora-Barefield and Clarecastle) will work closely with Fr O'Gorman to ensure continuity of Sacramental and church services in our parish. It is envisaged that our Parish Council and Pastoral Council will take on more proactive roles in the conduct of parochial and pastoral affairs.

In the meantime, we are all very sorrowful at the loss of Fr. McCormack, a much beloved pastor and friend to all. We wish him every success in his new post.

Farewell

I first came to Quin in July 2013, to be an *Assistant Pastor* (AP) to the late Fr. Michael Collins, P.P. He introduced me to the parish and to many of its parishioners. Sadly, Fr. Collins was to pass away a year and a half later (19th February 2015) and his death occasioned a great outpouring of sadness throughout parish and diocese.

Since then, I have been *Parish Administrator*, a role that I have come to enjoy most heartily. In a relatively short space of time, I have gotten to know many of you in all parts of the parish, Maghera, Clooney and Quin (embracing 78 townslands) and I have been overwhelmed by your kindness and generosity towards me at all times. In my Sunday homilies, I have occasionally referred to my priestly vocation and to the joy it has brought to my life. That joy is now much enhanced as a result of the friendship I encountered among you. You have added to my store of memories I will carry with me for the rest of my days. As I leave - with a heavy heart - I express my sincere thanks, and pray for God's blessings on you and your families at all times into the future.
