Bridges Restored in Clooney: Two old stone bridges have been restored to their former glory in Clooney as a result of an initiative by the local Heritage Group. The Heritage Group was set up recently as part of the Clooney Spancilhill Community Development Group, and its aim is to record and protect the history and heritage of the Clooney Spancilhill area. Work to clear the old stone bridges in Carrahan and Rylane began after the bridges were surveyed and given the green light by Clare County Council engineers. Working within current social distancing guidelines, locals gave freely of their time and energy during recent weeks to remove all ivy and vegetation from the bridges. Carrahan bridge has been cleared of all overgrowth and access to the river has been restored, revealing old stone steps leading to the water's edge. There has been a great response by the local community, with people praising the beauty of the bridges and local children playing by the riverside.

The local Heritage Group would like to thank all the local people involved in the efforts as well as Clare County Council for their help and contribution to the project to date. Work will begin on other bridges in the area once they have been approved for works by Council engineers.
