**Trocaire:** The annual Trocaire Lenten campaign begins on Ash Wednesday. Trocaire is the Irish word for Mercy. For the past 51 years Irish people have shown great Trocaire to people who are poor and suffering all over the world. Trocaire boxes are now available in all our churches. Remember that you cannot get to heaven without a letter of reference from the poor.

**A Day of Fast and Abstinence:** There are two days each year in the Catholic Faith that we are asked to fast and abstain - Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting means that one full meatless meal can be eaten in the day. Two other meatless meals may be taken to maintain strength but together they should not exceed one full meal. Those in good health between the age of 18 until 59 are asked to observe the fast.

**Ash Wednesday and the Lenten season**: This year Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day. Lent comes from the word Lenten, the beginning of the new season of Spring, longer days. In our Christian tradition we are encouraged to reflect on the meaning of our Christian calling and also to deal with personal obstacles that hinder our spiritual growth. Beginning with Ash Wednesday, one of the more popular rituals, the reception of ashes, to remind us of our mortal fate and also in preparation for the feast of the Resurrection when Christ conquers death. The blessing and distribution of Ashes will take place at the 10am Mass in St Mary's Church Quin on Ash Wednesday.
